

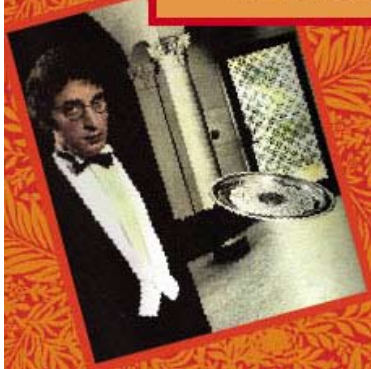

Procol Harum are a rock group best known for the hit single “A Whiter Shade of Pale,” which shot the band to global recognition during the summer of love in 1967. Four decades on the band continues to make music in a distinctive idiom that still draws dedicated fans to their concert performances. As emblematic as the songs of Procol Harum itself, *The Waiter Brought a Tray* is a memoir that explores, with wry humour and poignant reflection, the passion of a devoted enthusiast for the music that has shaped his life.

The author of *The Waiter Brought a Tray*, George Lovell, is Professor of Geography at Queen’s University in Canada and Visiting Professor in Latin American History at Universidad Pablo de Olavide in Spain. Much of his scholarly work deals with the colonial legacy that Procol Harum engage in one of their most popular songs, “Conquistador.” He has travelled across Europe and North America to hear Procol Harum play live in concert on twenty-seven occasions.
